

SAVE OUR JOINERY CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED TO PROTECT VITAL COMMUNITY SPACE



Save Our Spaces has just launched its first major campaign, **'Save Our Joinery',** aimed at safeguarding one of Adelaide's most cherished and active community venues.



Located in the heart of the city, the Joinery is home to **over 100 community organisations** ranging from environmental advocacy groups to creative arts collectives. For ten years, it has served as a gathering place, event hub, and educational centre that fosters collaboration and grassroots action.

Since its inception the Joinery has hosted over **4000 events and 50,000 visitors**; in 2023/24 alone, the Joinery hosted 456 events involving 112 organisations.

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State light of recent In Government plans for urban redevelopment, the Joinery now faces demolition with no clear or affordable alternative provided for the many groups who rely on facilities. This jeopardises its crucial volunteer-driven initiatives, social programs, workshops, and countless other activities essential to Adelaide's civic and cultural fabric.

"The Joinery is more than just a building; it's a vibrant ecosystem passionate people of and impactful ideas," said a spokesperson for Save Our Spaces. "We fear that losing it would fragment these networks and leave many communitydriven projects without a home."





Government The State has announced broad plans to redevelop the site into residential, commercial, and retail spaces, but no formal commitments have been made to preserve or replace the valuable functions the Joinery provides. Save Our Spaces is Premier calling on Peter Malinauskas and Lord Mayor Dr. Jane Lomax-Smith AM to **prioritise** interests of grassroots the organisations and ensure they have a seat at the table in shaping the future of this vital public space.








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"We all need community!! We need physical places for that community building to happen," shared a concerned citizen who frequents the Joinery for community gardening sessions. "As councils continue to destroy our third places, it leaves these community groups even more isolated and vulnerable."



Recognising the potential loss for Adelaide's social and environmental movements, Save Our Spaces emphasises that **over 100 groups – spanning environmental advocacy, youth programs, cultural events, and more – will be directly impacted**. The coalition is actively working on petitions, media outreach, and collaborations with local leaders to highlight the importance of the Joinery's continued presence in the CBD.





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"We invite the public to join our movement — sign the petition, attend our open gatherings, and share personal stories on social media," the SOS spokesperson added. "We strongly believe that vibrant, community-led spaces like the Joinery are the bedrock of a thriving, inclusive Adelaide."

Save Our Spaces is a grassroots coalition dedicated to protecting reimagining crucial and spaces across community Adelaide (Tarntanya). Through advocacy campaigns, volunteerled events, and collaborations with stakeholders, SOS strives to preserve the city's cultural and civic heritage while **championing new** sustainable, models for community-owned venues.



HOME ACTIVITIES

Easy ways to improve your community and make life a little more solarpunk!

Simplest bread recipe

first start with about a cup of flour. then add about a cup of water.

you'll want to mix this together and generally add either a pinch of salt or add $\frac{1}{3}$ cup of sugar.

once it's somewhat like how you'd expect pancake mix to be put it in the microwave for around 3-4 minutes.

test that it's cooked through or put it in for a little longer.

you can do this with just flour and water or any liquid that would cook well into it like a milk.

sometimes I add food dye or sprinkles. Sometimes it can be more savory.

Try it out and you'll have a cheap extra food option.

often when you see a community mini library it will be a wooden cupboard but a weather safe box or bag will work fine.


place 2 cans of food in there and an extra that's either a book to give away, some art to give away or maybe some jars.





CONNECTING WITH THE WORLD AROUND US

With the artificial rhythms of our constructed environment, it is easy to lose track of the patterns and cycles of our ecosystem. The first step to valuing the world around us is to be aware of it's changes.





Current Kaurna Season: Parnati

(Approx Apr-Jun)

Indicators: (Source)

- In April, Parna, a star near the Moon on the lower left side
- Pukarra (north/west wind)
 Cold mornings with Kudmu (fog/ dew) on the ground
 highest rainfall movement
 Waadlawarnka (fallen trees)

5 Apr Planting guide for sowing seeds in Adelaide (April)

- >Veggies: brassicas (e.g. broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower), broad beans*, garlic, kale, leek, lettuce and other salad greens, onion, pak choi, parsnip, peas, potatoes, silverbeet, spinach, spring onion, swede, turnip
- **Herbs**: chives, coriander, dill, oregano, parsley, thyme
- Flowers for pollinators:
 - calendula, cornflower, lavender, sweet alyssum

*better suited to cooler areas such as the Adelaide Hills

Plant and Animal Indicators

- Mullet netted in shallows during high tides
- Small stone fruits eaten
- Roots, possums, kangaroos, wallabies and bandicoots caught and eaten
- Wild tobacco leaves/flower chewed and small stone fruits eaten
- Roots, yams, wild cabbage, seeds eaten
- Yellowfin whiting, mulloway, salmon trout in estuaries
- Reed beds turn to boggy swamp, birdlife plentiful
